What is a Paptomime?

Pantomime is silent acting without words. True, except for the British Pantomime which could only have come into being in the unique atmosphere of the British theatre world of the 18th and 19th centuries and is now an institution in the UK, as well as in many of the former Dominions. Evolving as a combination of the song and dance of the music hall tradition with the popular London theatre of the mid-Victorian period (with an emphasis on audience involvement) it can at times become very noisy indeed! Its basics include a Dame (always played by a man), a Principal Boy (always played by a girl) and a Principal Girl (also played by a girl.) Its broad declamatory style of playing involves music, many asides and much audience participation.

Its continuing popularity is probably based upon the fact that it operates on two levels. For kids of all ages there are the silly jokes and slapstick humour usually combined in a fairy-tale story with princesses, fairies, demons and much magic. For adults the humour is, at times, a little broader and also provides a platform for sly comment on social and political issues of the day. The singularly most important thing to remember is that Pantomime is fun! A trip to the pantomime is always a rewarding experiencefor the whole family.

Panto at the OK Corral: Synopsis

In this unusual variation on the traditional British pantomime, Clint Westwood rides into Deadwood Gulch to seek revenge on Sheriff Small Holding for the latter's earlier misdeeds. He meets Winnie Pegg and her daughter Jane, who are about to be thrown from their land by the Sheriff's deputies, Butch Casserole and The Sun-Tanned Kid.

Also involved are James the Jessie, Buffalo (on account of the way he smells) Bill and Chief Running Bear, Goldie Nuggetts and her young gang of Gold Prospectors, Diamond Lil and her saloon girls Buttons and Bows, not forgetting Lightning, Winnie's thoroughbred horse.
